 - (b) The execution of a search warrant when the required thing is found beyond the jurisdiction of issuing court.
4. State under what circumstances a receiver can be appointed by Court and the duties of receiver so appointed.
5. (a) What are the conditions governing the imposition of a sentence of imprisonment in default of a fine?
(b) What are the provisions relating to sentence in cases of conviction for several offences at one trial?
6. What are the rules governing remands to police custody by Magistrates?

 - (b) Commencement of period of limitation
 - (c) Lapsed deposit
8. (a) Explain the procedure to be followed by a Court of Session on receipt of valuable properties from a Magistrate.
